



INTERMEDIATE MAINTENANCE OF TRAFFIC

A two-day/16-hour FDOT Certification Course

Target Audience: This course is required for DOT District employees, municipal public works, streets/roads, parks, water utility and/or other city or county employees who are responsible for supervising and/or inspecting the installation, removal, and field maintenance of temporary traffic control (TTC) devices, (excluding temporary barriers, end treatments and crash cushions).

Temporary Traffic Control (TTC) is needed to ensure both workers and the public can work in or travel through temporary work zones without property damage or injury. Effective TTC involves planning, design, supervision, implementation, and maintenance of various work zone traffic control devices. Included in this course's learning objectives:

- Details safe work practices as described in the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) and those regularly practiced by construction and public agency work crews
- Identifies and addresses common TTC needs and exposures and the proper use of TTC devices
- Analyses of specific worksite safety scenarios and how to properly utilize TTC devices

Course Outline includes the following specific elements:

- General / Fundamental Principles
- Temporary Traffic Control Elements (Chapter 6d. Pedestrian & Worker Flagger Control)
- Temporary Traffic Control Devices
- Type of Temporary Traffic Control Zone Activities
- Control of Traffic Through Traffic Incident Management Areas

This course utilizes DOT-provided course materials, and each participant receives a DOT-certified wallet card (with passing grade on DOT's final exam).
