



Hazard Communication

Virtual or In-Person Safety Training Course

Target Audience: This course is designed specifically for DOT District employees, municipal public works, streets/roads, parks, water utility and/or other city or county employees who are exposed to hazardous materials in the performance of their scopes of work.

Supervisors and Trainers: Also recommended for division supervisors, agency safety officers, department safety coordinators, and equipment trainers.

Additional applications would be as an orientation for new employees and a good refresher for team members.

This 2-hour course provides participants with a basic understanding of the Federal Hazard Communication Standard's "Right-to-Know" on potential workplace hazards. This standard allows for all employees who work with hazardous materials to be made be aware of the hazards and necessary precautions to avoid harmful exposure. Course includes the following components:

- What is the *Globally Harmonized System (GHS)* and why has OSHA adopted it?
- How should employees utilize and interpret Safety Data Sheets (SDS)?
- What are the most common pictograms included in the GHS?
- What are the most common chemical hazards that employees will face in their jobs and how can harmful exposure be avoided?
- What is the correct procedure(s) should there be a chemical spill?
