MORE ABOUT OUR NEW TRAINING PROGRAMS

GRAPPLE TRUCK

This course is designed specifically for DOT, municipal public works, parks, streets/roads, water, wastewater, distribution/collection and/or storm water utility workers or any other government entity employees who may be called on to operate grapple trucks. It includes accident case studies, reviews of relevant OSHA standards, and general work zone safety considerations. Participants will learn about equipment orientation through operator videos, covering machine components, controls, and safe operating principles. The course also covers external and internal work zone setups, referencing MUTCD guidelines for traffic control and discussing the use of barriers and proper equipment positioning. Additional topics include commercial vehicle driver safety rules, essential pedestrian worker guidelines, crane and boom operation safety, special tasks involving heavy equipment, and the importance of pre-job briefings and equipment inspections.

<u>MUNICIPAL VEHICLE DRIVER SAFETY (NON CDL-LICENSED)</u>

This course provides practical training in large vehicle operations and driver safety, incorporating any agency-specific policies and procedures. Learning objectives include basic safety practices such as backing, accident handling, and driving on interstates, highways, and municipal routes. The course also covers maneuvering, identifying unsafe behaviors, and navigating driving hazards like intersections, roundabouts, and adverse weather conditions, along with key state and local statutes. Defensive driving basics, the five keys to safe driving, and hands-on activities like vehicle backing, navigating tight turns, trailer towing, vehicle inspection, and working with spotters are also included.

COMMERCIAL UTILITY VEHICLE DRIVER SAFETY (FOR CDL-LICENSED)

This full-day course is designed for government agency field workers and supervisors who are CDL-licensed drivers or operate large utility or commercial vehicles. It also serves as a valuable orientation for new employees and a refresher for experienced team members. The course offers practical training in large vehicle operations and driver safety, incorporating agency-specific policies and procedures. Key learning objectives include basic safety practices such as vehicle backing, accident handling, and driving on interstates, highways, and municipal routes. The course also covers maneuvering, identifying unsafe behaviors, navigating driving hazards, understanding key state and local statutes, and mastering defensive driving basics. Hands-on activities include vehicle backing, navigating tight turns, trailer towing, vehicle inspection, and working with spotters.
